

And, finally the convention; I can hardly believe we have been working on this for almost 3 years and we are now coming down to the July big event.


If you have not registered, please do so, and if you are able volunteer to help out the Keystone and Delmarva Chapters. We can always use the help.

Jim and Linda Rogers' 34 Pontiac HPOF Award





I found the car in a garage near my home in Freeland. It had been sitting a number of years. The carburetor was rebuilt and the gas tank cleaned and sealed. It was given a tune-up and the car was running. After driving it, the tires were flat spotted so new tires were put on. The car is an unrestored original with a 223 cu straight 8 that produces 84 hp. The car has a few options: city horn, front bumper, bumper guards, hard spare tire cover, and right brake light. It has a three-speed standard transmission and mechanical brakes at all four wheels. The exterior paint and interior are all original, which includes seats, carpet, and headliner. The model number is 34309. The car gets a lot of attention at shows, especially the AACA Fall Meet, which this



year will be the 14th year it has been shown there. It was in the "Garage Finds" display at the AACA Museum in 2018. It is a POCI Gold Junior winner twice and, most recently, awarded the HPOF National Award from the AACA for vehicles 1930 through 1990.





