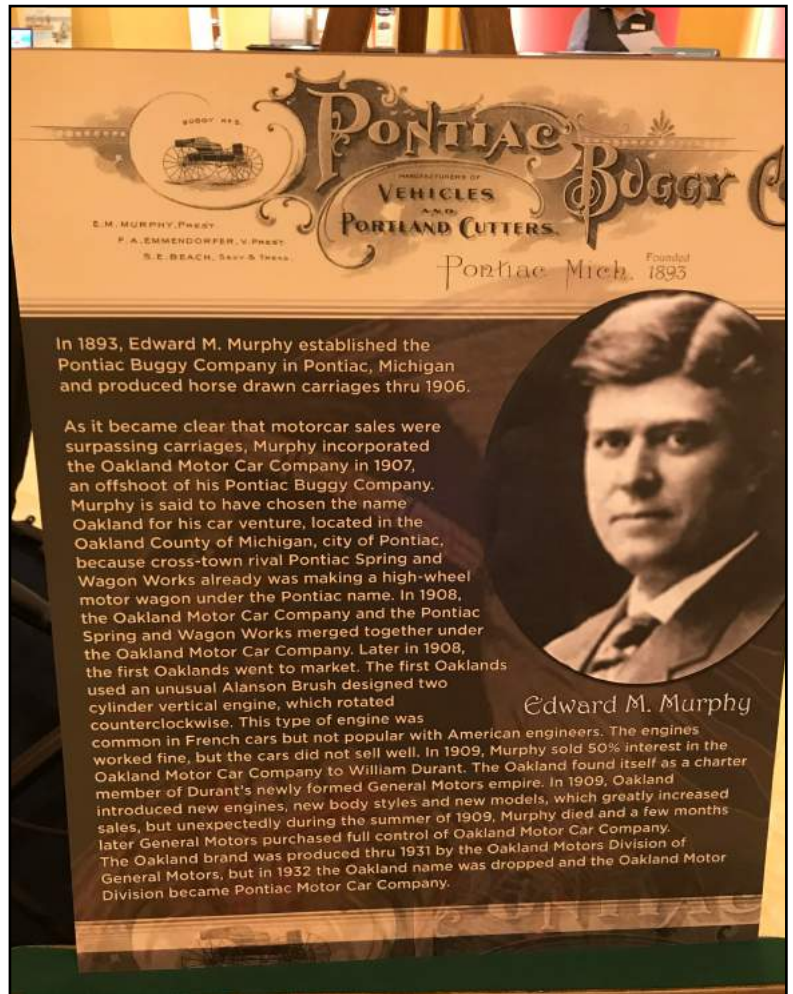
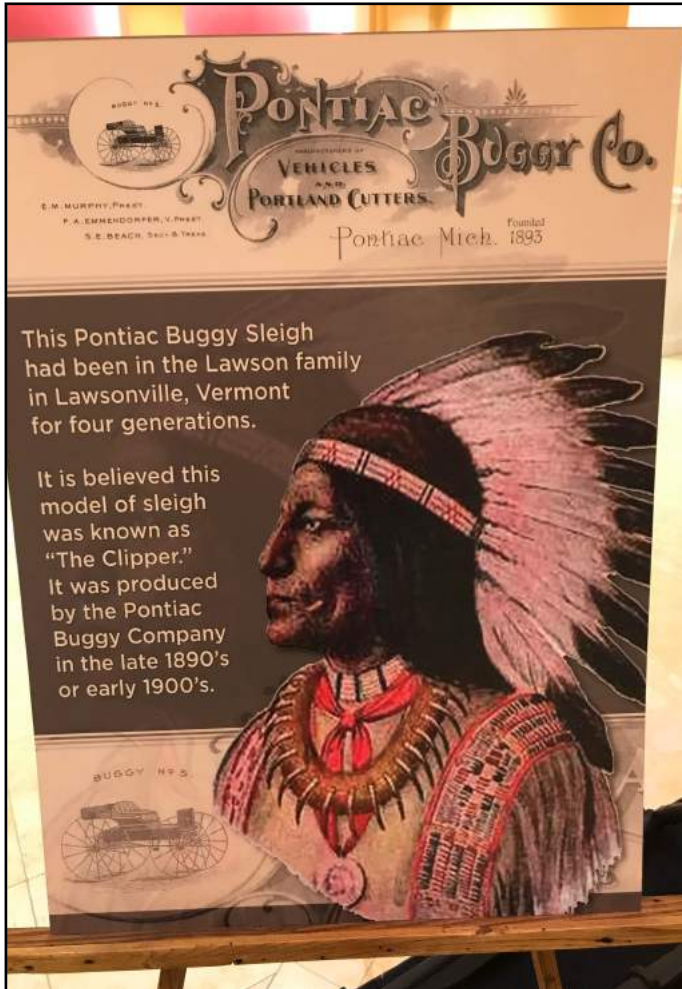

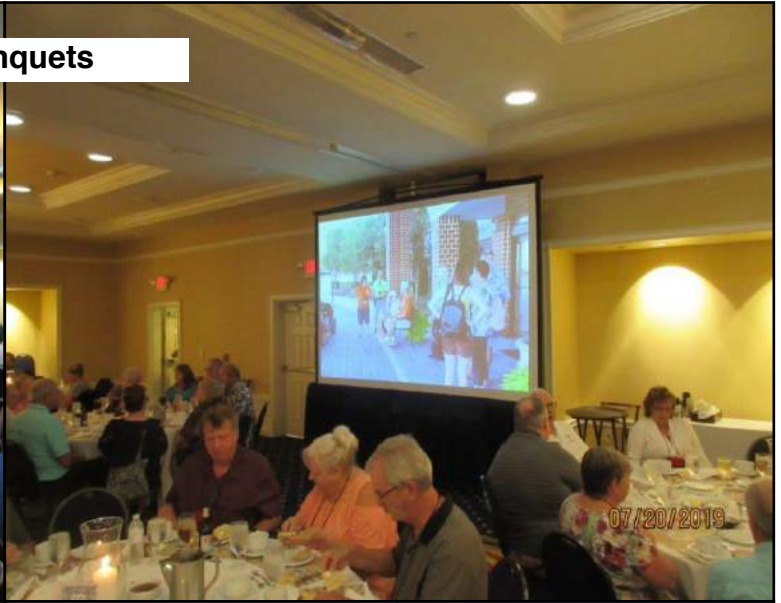

During 1973, Don Barlup's offer to host the first show at his Pizza Drive-In, in Camp Hill, PA was accepted. Don was an avid old car enthusiast, who frequently hosted car shows and cruise in type affairs at his Pizza restaurant. The first show on Sunday, October 7, 1973, the Sunday following the Hershey show, drawing 31 cars. It was a one day event, with a very small flea

market. The typical fall weather was cool, breezy, and overcast in the morning, changing to a nice sunny day in the afternoon. Don provided the dash plaques, window cards, and everything else necessary for the show, at his own expense. Alan Mayes was the official club photographer for the event, and provided the photos used in the Newsletter. Alan also provided copies from the original slides, for us to use in the historical display boards at the Gettysburg convention. The show was deemed a success, and the club was moving ahead quickly. It should be noted that Don once again played host to the KSC for our very first meeting and spring show, in April of 1975, just 2 years after the first POCI show, and again at the same location, so a lot of history goes with that location.
