

I'm Rick Harding, I've been a member of Keystone Chapter since 1992.

I have been employed by Weaver Industries Inc.a graphite machine for 42 years where I started working while I was in Votech school. Currently I'm manager of the Production Planning Department there and one of the more interesting projects I got to work on was when we took on a project machining components that went to Mars in 2012. I grew up in Reinholds and currently live with my Fiance Brenda Grumbling in Denver, a neighbouring town from where I grew up. For years I have been doing a Christmas Walk though display in my yard. Currently I'm undecided about this year's display. I have a daughter Kelly which some members may remember her from when she was a child and came along to some club activities. As a teenager she bought a 89 Trans Am which is currently sitting at my place in need of restoration.

I grew up around Pontiacs, my Dad had a 56 Pontiac and a 63 Lemans conv. and when I was 4 years old my brother bought a new 65 GTO conv. As a teenager my first Pontiac was a 72 Lemans Sport which I later traded in for a new 79 Sunbird. Then I went for about 5 years without Pontiac except for a 68 GTO project car which I later realized would have cost way more to restore than they were worth back then so I bought a good modified 68 GTO in 1989. Back in 1992 Diet and Gloria Aseli who were members of the Keystone State Chapter went to the same church I did and they had heard that I had a GTO and asked me to come along to the Fall show at Jones which led to me joining POCI and Keystone State Chapter.

In 1994 I bought a 1970 GTO Convertible which when new was originally sold by Jones Pontiac. After a minor engine fire upon arriving at the Fall Meet at Jones Pontiac in 1995 I decided to take it off the frame to fully detail the undercarriage, chassis and engine compartment. Since I was on a budget I did most of the work myself in my one car garage, it took over 5 years until I had it back together and on the road.

I currently still have the 70 GTO Convertible but I did just recently sell off my 2008 Solstice GXP and replaced it with a more practical all season vehicle, a 2007 G6 GT Hardtop Convertible. The G6 has low miles but has some cosmetic issues which is fine for an affordable fun convertible to drive anywhere. Also the day after Christmas we found a super low miles 2007 G6 GT for Brenda. Picked that up at Geoff Penske dealership in Shillington with just under 12,000 miles. So I guess we now have his and hers G6's. LOL.


Over the years I've had about 20 to 25 Pontiacs!!

If every member would (SHOULD) return their ballot, we could benefit in three ways;


FIRST: Recognition at the 2021 Awards Banquet for the most returned ballots
